MINUTES

1. OPENING

a. Call to Order & Roll Call

Mayor Browning called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Present were Mayor David Browning, Vice Mayor Ronald Jarriel and Council Members Todd McLendon, Ryan Liang and Dave DeMarois. Also present was Town Manager William Underwood, Town Attorney Michael D. Cirullo, Jr., and Town Clerk Virginia Walton.

b. Pledge of Allegiance & Invocation – Mayor Browning

2. ORDER OF BUSINESS

a. Additions, Deletions or Modification, and Approval of Agenda

Council Member McLendon suggested that the Council continue all non-essential items on the agenda, and just approve the consent agenda and the two resolutions for the millage, the budget and the addition of the resolution for the solid waste assessment. The meeting could then be adjourned so that everyone could make final preparations for the hurricane. Vice Mayor Jarriel agreed but wanted to add to the consent agenda Item #6.1 Resolution No. 2017-65 State of Emergency and also the FAAC Report by Committee Member Jim Rockett. It was suggested that the report be done during public comments to save time. Consensus was in agreement of changes.

Motion: a motion to approve the agenda, as amended, was made by Council Member McLendon and seconded by Council Member Liang. Motion passed 5 – 0.

3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Frank Eukitis, Collecting Canal Road, wanted to know when his road would get some maintenance, as it was in very bad condition, even though Bergeron had graded a week ago. Mr. Eukitis was advised that the Town had just taken over this Road and there was a bid out now for gravel road grading and other road services.

Bill Louda, E Road, announced that Jane Cleveland with the Wellington Equestrian Group had contacted him and wanted to meeting with the RETGAC Committee.

Jim Rockett, 43rd Road N, a member of the FAAC Committee stated that the committee meeting were similar to Town Council meetings, but not with regard to voting. He advised the Committee discussed setting meeting dates with automatic alternate dates in case of

cancellations. He requested that the Council liaison be the central point person to send reminders of each meeting. He further advised that the Committee reviewed several line items, and had voted 2 – 1 against the increased millage rate. He recommended the Council should use the funding that they have and go after a re-negotiation of the Sheriff's increase with the Sheriff himself. The new program for trailers should not have any out-of-pocket costs to the Town.

Mayor Browning reminded everyone that there had been several meetings with the Sheriff's Staff and there was no negotiation; just go with them or form our own department. Vice Mayor Jarriel stated they did go directly to the Sheriff. The Council took no action on the Town's policy relative to requirements for Committee meeting procedures.

7. RESOLUTIONS

a. RESOLUTION NO. 2017-59 (Millage)

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF LOXAHATCHEE GROVES, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING THE TENTATIVE MILLAGE FOR THE TOWN OF LOXAHATCHEE GROVES, FLORIDA, PURSUANT TO THE BUDGET SUMMARY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018, IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 200, FLORIDA STATUTES, AS AMENDED; SETTING FORTH THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE FOR THE SECOND AND FINAL PUBLIC HEARING TO ADOPT THE TOWN'S MILLAGE RATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018 AND DIRECTING PUBLICATION OF NOTICE THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Town Attorney Cirullo read the resolution by title and advised that the proposed millage would be 2.6, which was a 94.93% increase over the rollback rate of 1.338. The date of the final hearing would be September 19, 2017. Town Manager Underwood introduced a power point presentation showing a history of increases and/or decreases in property values, ad valorem revenues, millage rates and solid waste assessments for the past several years, and identified which revenue funds would be used to offset expenditures. Council questioned the Manager on the 50/50 program for roads, gas tax revenues, and possible assistance from Tallahassee on

infrastructure projects. Council was advised that they could always lower the millage at final budget hearing, but could not raise it after tonight's vote.

Jim Rockett, 43rd Road, stated he did not see his 77% increase in taxes discussed; and thought the Council was not getting all sides of the issue, but getting a biased opinion. Other resources were available such as business taxes from commercial. He also suggested that the Town should not subsidize the solid waste as much, and consider a Line of Credit for hurricane expenses, and use Town Reserves for the Sheriff's Contract.

Council Member McLendon responded that it was a mistake to use Reserves for the ongoing Sheriff's Contract. They could look at other funding in the future; but he hasn't heard any residents ask for a decrease in services to save on taxes.

Vice Mayor Jarriel added that the Sheriff had kept the cost low for the past 10 years and they could not even hire a security company for that amount.

Mayor Browning added that it was not a 77% increase. It was about \$12.70 per resident and with the solid waste subsidy, it came to about \$6 per year for most. He did not believe in touching the Reserves for this and a Line of Credit just scared him. They needed to approve or come up with a reasonable plan alternative.

Motion: a motion to approve the tentative millage of 2.6 was made by Council Member McLendon and seconded by Council Member Liang. Motion passed 4 – 1, with Council Member DeMarois dissenting.

Town Attorney Cirullo read the resolution by title. Vice Mayor Jarriel commented that in 2008, the assessment was \$372.72, so there had been a large decrease due to the Town's subsidizing this assessment.

Motion: a motion to approve the resolution and assessment rate was made by Council Member McLendon and seconded by Council Member DeMarois. Motion passed 5 – 0.

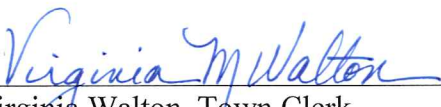

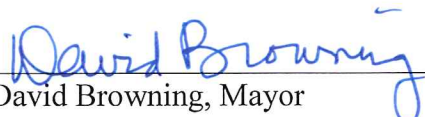
